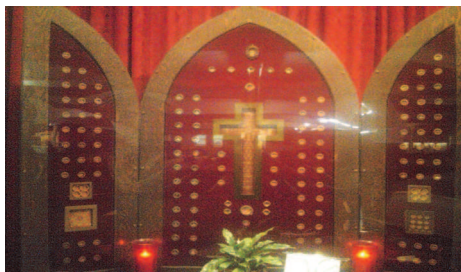

† Our Sacramental Policy †

Six-month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage.

Baptisms: Second Sunday of the month; Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requires that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic; and the Godparents must be active, practicing, fully initiated Catholics at least 16 years of age. If two Godparents: must be 1 male & 1 female; if one Godparent: may be male or female.

Marriage: Arrangements must be made at least nine months in advance. Please call the rectory office. Officiate at the ceremony must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Funerals: Officiate must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Please note: The services of the Parish Organist are used for all sacramental liturgies.

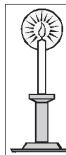

Pilgrimage to Carey

The Holy Family Society and I went to Carey, Ohio to visit the Basilica and National Shrine of Our Lady of Consolation on Friday the 23rd. (Pictures are on the front of today's bulletin.) It was a wonderful experience. The Holy Family Society (HFS) arrived early for Mass and two of the boys were able to serve for Fr. Stowe, who is the rector.

We went to the cafeteria for a brown bag lunch and enjoyed each other's company.

After lunch, we met Brother Randy, who gave us a tour of the Basilica and history of the Statue of Our Lady of Consolation and the parish church, which is now entrusted to the Conventual Franciscans. He showed us the different relics that they had in the lower church. There were also a number of gifts given, and crutches and other medical equipment left because of miraculous healings that have taken place.

After the tour, we joined another priest who led us in a living Rosary. Father exposed the Blessed Sacrament and we prayed Marian Devotions. After the Blessed Sacrament was reposed in the tabernacle, two of the priests and two of the brothers blessed each of us with a relic of the True Cross. That was very powerful. As father blessed me with the Cross, it felt as if power rushed out of the relic and into and through me. It gave me a great sense of peace and nearly brought me to tears.

Afterwards, Brother Randy loaned us Books for the Stations of the Cross, which we prayed out doors at the Shrine Park. The Stations are located around the edge of the park, which is 30 acres. It had stopped raining and warmed up a bit, so it made for a great walk through the park while praying the Stations.

Then, we went to the original church that is located across the street from the Basilica to make a visit with Jesus and to pray. A number of prayers were offered by the HFS for numerous intentions.

Many departed for home, while a few of us went to the Shrine Gift Shop. I was out of holy water from there, so I bought a few water bottles to fill with Holy Water to keep in the car when I go to bless houses. Then, we departed for home.

It was a nice visit and a very powerful experience for me. If anyone would like to make a day trip some time in the Spring, please let me know. I would love to visit again.

New Translation

We will be practicing before Mass the sung Mass parts for one of the new Mass settings. Archbishop Vigneron has granted permission to practice before Mass. He is allowing us to begin to sing these Mass parts on Oct 22nd/23rd. The priests will still have to say the current translation. The new translation will be formally used as a whole beginning Nov 26th/27th – the first Sunday of Advent.
