Thanks again for all your help volunteering and for all those that dined.

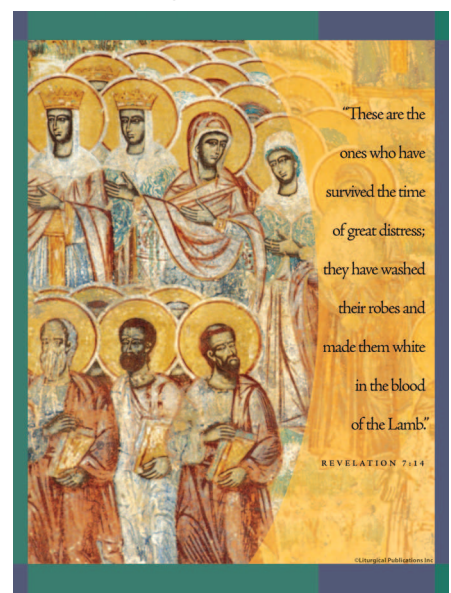

† Our Sacramental Policy †

Six-month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage.

Baptisms: Second Sunday of the month; Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requires that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic; and the Godparents must be active, practicing, fully initiated Catholics at least 16 years of age. If two Godparents: must be 1 male & 1 female; if one Godparent: may be male or female.

Marriage: Arrangements must be made at least nine months in advance. Please call the rectory office. Officiate at the ceremony must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Funerals: Officiate must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Please note: The services of the Parish Organist are used for all sacramental liturgies.

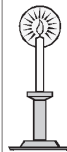

Archdiocese of Detroit. It was printed in late August, but it seems that many didn't see the article now that I am asking for team leaders for the Changing Lives Together – Capital Campaign.

Program I: The CSA is complete, but we are behind in our pledges. The CSA target is somewhat of a tax much like the parish assessment. The Archdiocese of Detroit sets the target and the parish must meet it or pay the difference out of our operating budget or savings.

Our CSA Target is \$45,065. To date, we have had 214 people pledge the amount of \$34,235 with \$24,152 received through the office. So currently, we are \$10,830 short or out goal. Phone calls were made to anyone who had not pledged; we'll have the final numbers next week.

Program II: The Archdiocese studied parishes over ten years ago with the "Together in Faith" program. Now we are in Phase 2 of the study. 4 of our parishioners were in meetings twice a month since around the beginning of the calendar year. They analyzed parish and demographic data and presented recommendations to the Regional Coordinators. The data and analysis was collected and put into a format that will be reviewed by the Archdiocese. There will be a few meetings in the Fall to finalize Phase 2 and we should hear what was recommended.

Program III: Archbishop Vigneron has begun a stewardship initiative called "Changing Lives Together". This initiative, in our parish, will begin this fall with Wave Three. The goal of the initiative is to promote spirituality, activity, and financial stewardship in every parish. Ultimately, we will have a "kick off" Sunday in the fall, at which time the program will begin in our parish. I will be at an orientation meeting for priests on Tuesday to be briefed on what is expected and to see what happened during Wave One and Two.

When the Archbishop came to Detroit, he was made aware of parishes that had long term debt that were not making payments back to the Loan Deposit Program. To keep the AOD in good financial order, it was suggested that a stewardship initiative would be necessary. As reported before, the parish would keep 70% of the donations and 30% would go to the Archdiocese for its various projects, such as seminary education costs, priestly education, and keeping a Catholic presence in the city of Detroit. If the parish has no obligations to the AOD, they keep the total of their 70% raised. If the parish has obligations, 75% of the parish's 70% goes to pay of their debt.

Since we do not have any debt, the total amount of the 70% we raise will go directly towards parish projects here at St. Anthony's. We will be discussing a number of options to target. A few that have been suggested already are fixing the cracks in the church's murals and restoring the paintings themselves, the stained glass windows (re-lead and put protective glass over the East windows), covering the insulation in Kenna Hall, redoing the bathrooms in Kenna and Padua Halls, updating the kitchen in Kenna, redoing the Kenna Hall parking lot. If you have any other suggestions, please contact me or parish council with your ideas.

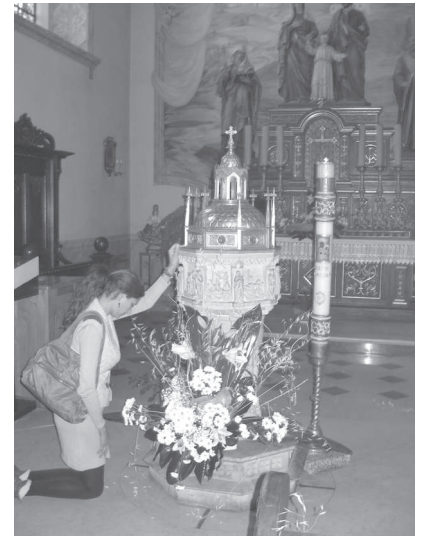
