Our Sacramental Policy

Six-month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage.

Baptisms: Second Sunday of the month; Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requires that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic; and the Godparent/s must be an active, practicing, fully initiated Catholic at least 16 years of age. Two Godparents: must be 1 male & 1 female; One Godparent: may be male or female.

Marriage: Arrangements must be made at least **nine** months in advance. Please call the rectory office. Officiate at the ceremony must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Funerals: Officiate must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Please note: The services of the Parish Organist are used for all sacramental liturgies.

Fr. Brian's Blarney Cemetery

I am pleased with how clean the cemetery looks. For the most part, the cemetery has looked well since the April clean up. Unfortunately, we have had a few unwelcome visitors in the cemetery. There are cats that go into the shed and hide out and do their business in there and the guys have to clean it out. Because of this, we are going to have a door installed on the shed.

Even worse, we have had a number of kids hanging out in the cemetery at night. Thankfully, our neighbors have been chasing them out at night. Someone defecated in one of the buckets that held the sexton's tools, which is beyond proper decorum for anywhere let alone a Catholic Cemetery. The neighbors fear they are drinking or doing drugs in the Cemetery or dealing drugs.

So, effective immediately, we are going to be locking the gates at night and opening up the cemetery during the day. I am not sure yet what we will be doing on the weekend, but that will be figured out soon enough.

We will be looking in to getting a man door installed into the fence, so that people will at least be able to walk in to pay their respects to their loved ones. Right now, we need to eliminate the vehicle traffic at night, to cut down on the unwanted visitors and hopefully, prevent any further damage to the property.

Please bear with us until we figure the best way to handle the security of the cemetery.

Monuments and Head Stones.

Unfortunately, we are tightening up the rules regarding monuments. There is going to be a size limitation and specifications for images and sayings. We are ironing this out, but we are going back to the requirement of a crucifix/cross on the monument. If there are any other images, they must be of Catholic Sentiment, such as a picture of a saint. If there is a quotation, it must be from the bible or from a saint. It may not be secular in nature. A number of funeral directors stated that they fax in the prints of the monuments/head stones with dimensions, pictures or quotes for approval before final purchase and placement. We will begin this as well.

Certificate of Burial

Many people have mistaken the paperwork they receive regarding the "deed" for their burial plots. In fact, they are simply "Certificates of Burial". The name of the document will change to reflect this fact. The property is owned by the Archbishop of Detroit and maintained by the parish. In purchasing a plot, one is simply purchasing the rights to bury their loved one there.

We are adopting this language after consultation with the cemetery and people that have supervised Whiteford Township Cemetery. They had to make the change in order to clarify the relationship of the property owner (Whiteford Township) and the family of the deceased who is buried there.

My hope is that it will reflect the proper relationship of the family of the deceased and the parish and the Archdiocese of Detroit. I hope that it will put things into proper perspective. People lately have taken it upon themselves to place items in the Cemetery that frankly violate custom and decorum and should be left in their gardens. Some items are pagan in nature and will probably have to be removed. Others are simply not appropriate for the Cemetery and should be left home.

Rude Behavior

I cannot believe the extremely rude behavior of some (generally non-parishioners) after the Cemetery rules were changed. There have been people calling screaming at my staff or me. That is simply unacceptable. We are not customer service representatives somewhere in India trying to speak the language or giving you the runaround. We are parish members and church employees (heaven forbid someone would talk this way to their mother or father and have talked like this to a priest or his staff members).

Dress at Funerals and Weddings

I have been noticing for the last year (here at St. Anthony's and elsewhere) the disregard for proper decorum at Mass regarding dress, especially for Sundays, but also for Weddings and Funerals. I have been appalled at the immodest dress of the women at these Masses with the shorts/shorts/skirts and low cut tops. But what has been even more appalling is that men and boys (over the age of 1st Communion) are coming to Mass in shorts and T-shirts with sandals, flip-flops, or sneakers. Today, most cars and parish churches have air conditioning, so heat is not a good excuse to dress for the beach. It also sets a poor example and creates a bad habit for the future.

I also have noticed people leaving their cell phones on when they enter the funeral homes for wakes or the parish churches for the various Masses. Again, not only is this improper decorum, but the gum breaks the one hour fast before Communion. I am also worried about people chewing gum and then receiving Holy Communion. When they throw out their gum, are they throwing out Jesus, too? I am going to have to start responding to these behaviors a bit more firmly when I see them, especially the gum chewing.

Christian Mothers

After a meeting with Bernice Heidleberg, we decided to revise the procedures for the honor guard to be present at funerals, especially since more and more people have been using the Narthex to have the body lie in-state before the Funeral Mass. We now have the Christian Mothers line up on the stairs going into the church. Then, after the family and pallbearers are seated, the funeral director seats the ladies. When processing in from the back, the ladies (following behind the cross and candle bearers) lead the casket into church. When being seated, they have the option of sitting with their spouses in the congregations or (with the permission of the family) in a reserved pew. At the end of the Funeral Mass, the Christian Mothers follow the cross and candle bearers leading the priest and casket out to the coach.

The new procedure seemed to work well at Jackie Nusbaum's funeral.
