



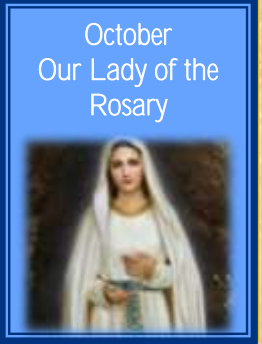

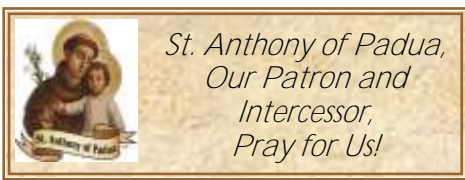



Six-month Parish registration and participation are required for Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage.

Baptisms: Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a baptism class. The Church requires that at least one of the parents be a practicing Catholic, and the Godparents must be active, practicing, fully initiated Catholics at least 16 years of age. If two Godparents: must be 1 male & 1 female; if one Godparent: may be male or female.

Marriage: Arrangements must be made at least nine months in advance. Please call the rectory office. Officiate at the ceremony must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Funerals: Officiate must be St. Anthony Parish Pastor or a family member.

Please note: The services of the Parish Organist are used for all sacramental liturgies.

Notes of Moderation

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our Blessed Lord, realizing that His departure from this world was imminent, made a promise to His disciples: "Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the World." (Mt. 28:20). The last few months have been challenging for all of us within the ***Lumen Christi*** Family of parishes. The departure of Fr. LaCuesta made it necessary to rearrange the liturgical schedules of all three parishes and significantly increased the pastoral demands placed upon Fr. Prill and myself. I was grateful to Fr. Prill for his generous spirit and willingness to cooperate with me in attempting to minister to the people of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, while maintain our ministries at St. Joseph and St. Anthony. This modification required patience and some sacrifice from all of us and I was both pleased and humbled at the grace and understanding of the parishioners of all three parishes. Many were not happy about the changes, but there was a realization that every effort was being made to tend to the Lord's flock as fairly as we were able. For a brief period of time, I thought we had a stable and sustainable situation.

Then we were informed of the departure of Fr. Prill. I know that this sudden departure has raised many questions and concerns in the hearts of the parishioners at St. Joseph. Many have begun to speculate and rumors have begun to spread. Fr. Prill has been given a leave of absence to tend to some personal matters. The Archdiocese has asked us to respect Fr.'s privacy in this matter and to hold him in prayer. I have not been provided with all the details, but I can inform you all that **any rumor of illegal activity is untrue and there is not truth to any rumor involving minor persons**. I am grateful for the years of service that Fr. Prill has provided to the faithful and we should all be mindful not to tarnish his good name. Please, for the healing of the parishes, let us pray for Fr. Prill and respect his privacy in this matter.

The question of how the *Lumen Christi* Family of Parishes is to move forward is still being discussed. While I would like to tell you that nothing will change, I'm afraid I cannot make such a promise. I am in discussions with all of the *Lumen Christi* staffs, as well as the Archdiocese about how to proceed. Please keep me in your prayers for wisdom and strength during this period of transition. It is important that you all know that you are not spiritual orphans. You have not been abandoned, and there is no conversation at this time about closing any parishes. I intend to provide for St. Joseph, St. Anthony, and Our Lady of Mt. Carmel as I am able and given the Grace by God. The Lord has not abandoned us! Let us not lose hope in His promise.

What is a Eucharistic Miracle? A Eucharistic Miracle is some extraordinary event or phenomenon, which manifests the Real Presence of Jesus in the Consecrated Bread and Wine in a way that we can discern with our ordinary senses. The manifestation may be as simple as a Consecrated Host floating on air, or as astonishing as a Host becoming visible human flesh.

But I don't believe in Eucharistic Miracles! Our belief in Jesus' Real Presence is based on Jesus's Own words found in the Bible (See Jesus' promise of the Eucharist, Jn 6; the institution narratives in Mt 26: 26-28, Mk 14: 22-24, Lk 23: 19-20; and warnings against abuse 1 Cor 11: 27-29) and on the lived Tradition of the Church. This is what we call Public Revelation. **The Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is a vital part of our Faith.** Eucharistic Miracles on the other hand are not part of the Public Revelation and so are called Private Revelations. We are not bound to believe Private Revelations, even if officially recognized by the Church. It is not their role to improve or complete Christ's definitive Revelation. However, they can help us to live by it more fully (CCC 67). Legitimate Private Revelations can contribute to a deeper understanding of the Mysteries of our Faith and to growth in love for the Lord.

In the Eucharist, we have Jesus Christ. We have His Redemptive Sacrifice, we have His Resurrection, we have the gift of the Holy Spirit, we have adoration, obedience and love of the Father. The importance of the Eucharist to our daily lives cannot be overstated. Spiritual growth is an imperative for all Christians. Some believe The Mystery, but do not grasp its implications or its dynamic power to impact their daily lives. Eucharistic miracles are a gift from God that recall us to the deeper meaning of this Mystery of our Faith.

Catholic Services Appeal - 2023

Dear Friends in Christ,

Each year, all parishes in the Archdiocese of Detroit embark upon the CSA (Catholic Services Appeal) Drive. The CSA is a required collection taken up for the general operational expenses of the Archdiocese of Detroit. It helps to subsidize Catholic institutions that may not necessarily be connected to or funded by a particular parish. Among these special services are Campus Ministry, Telecommunications, Hospital and Prison Chaplaincies, Central Service Offices, which provide direct assistance to individual parishes, the Marriage Tribunal, and the like. Since the CSA provides for 62% of the operating budget of the Archdiocese, we are assessed or taxed a specific amount we are asked to meet. Our assessment is based upon many factors, including parish registration, Sunday collections, and financial status of the area within our parish boundaries. The detail of how our assessment is calculated, as well as how the money is used may be found on the insert included with today's bulletin.

The amount assessed to St. Anthony Parish this year is **\$38,555**. In order to reach our goal, the recommended pledge amount will be **\$250** from each family.

For your convenience, pledge forms can be found at the bottom of this page. Please complete the form and designate the amount of your pledge and the payment plan you prefer and return to the Parish Office. Pledges may also be made by calling the Parish Office 734-854-1143; sending your pledge via email (stanthony@bex.net) or by stopping by the Parish Office during regular business hours.

Your pledge can be made in several ways: paid in full and returned with your pledge form; a down payment returned with your pledge form, with the balance divided into quarterly payments, or divided evenly among 9 monthly payments. Credit card and automatic withdrawal payments and electronic funds transfers (EFT) will also be accepted. If you wish to contribute this way, please go to: give.aodcsa.org. Please select "St. Anthony, Temperance" on the online form where indicated. Donors may also call (888) 331-8695 to make an online or EFT request.

Please note: If you sign up to make payments on your pledge, the payment schedule will not begin until July 2023.

Please remember that we are required to make an accounting of all CSA cards for our Parish, so even if you are unable to pledge, we ask that you indicate that to the Parish Office as well.

I am grateful for your continued stewardship and prayers.
