July 19, 2026, Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Matthew 13:24-43



A man recently told me he was losing patience with the Church. **“It’s supposed to be God’s Kingdom on earth,”** he said, **“but it’s full of contradictions and hypocrisy. Why can’t the Church just be better?”** That last word landed with a judgmental thud. It hurt. Because at times the Church can look painfully ordinary, even disappointing.

But Jesus' parables in today's Gospel meet that frustration head-on. He says, "**The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field,**" yet the weeds grow up with the wheat, and the master allows both to grow together until harvest. To his listeners, this sounded strange, even offensive. They expected God's reign to be pure, powerful, and glorious, anything but mixed up, hidden, or small.

Jesus is showing us something essential. The Kingdom always begins small and grows amid imperfection. Grace and weakness exist side by side until the harvest. That is why the Church often looks messy. Yet within that mess, God's quiet work continues. The weeds do not stop the wheat from growing.

When we see the Church's flaws or our own, it helps to remember that this is exactly the field in which Christ chose to plant. The miracle is not that everything looks perfect, but that his Word keeps taking root anyway.

Lord, give me patience with Your field, the Church. Help me see Your hidden life growing even among the weeds. Amen.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Even as we enjoy the warmth of the summer months and celebrate the 250th anniversary of the founding of our nation; it remains difficult not to realize there is a lingering anxiety regarding the future of our beloved little parish of St. Anthony. Whispers and suspicions continue about future plans, or a lack thereof, regarding what is going to occur next year. I suppose this reaction is natural. The feelings of fear, discouragement and anger are understandable when we face the possibility of losing something we treasure. I personally face the possibility of losing a home and a community that I have come to regard as my faith-family. In regards to this instability and anxiety, I am afraid that I have nothing new to report. The Archdiocese is still in its planning phase of the restructuring operation and I am also waiting for decisions to be announced. The planned announcements are scheduled for next April. Nevertheless, it is my intention to proceed with the expectation (and hope) that we do have a future and I am taking steps in that direction. I am happy to report that our little parish does remain financially stable (with some set aside for a rainy day) and our structures are in reasonable condition. I have secured additional help with maintenance to assist Paul in the growing tasks of keeping our grounds beautiful and functional, and we now have a new smiling face manning our parish office. Ms. Theresa Holup, now finishing her training, has joined our parish staff as our secretary. A long-time parishioner herself, Ms. Holup joins us with a deep faith in our Blessed Lord, an impressive skill set, and a deep-rooted affection for our parish. Her warmth and friendly demeanor have already left an impression. Please greet her and welcome her to the parish staff if you have not done so already.

We still have work to accomplish in the service of our Lord. A special thanks to all who responded to the AOD's questionnaire online. Our feedback is crucial to the decision-making process. I would also encourage those who have not yet responded to do so prior to the July 31st deadline. We remain surrounded by neighbors who need to hear of the love God has for them. Many of us have families and children who need to hear the Gospel anew. I believe that the mission of St. Anthony is far from complete. I would gently remind everyone that we are still behind on our C.S.A. goal which is a key evaluator on the sustainability of a parish. Let us continue to pray and build for the future trusting in the providence of our Lord.

Catholic Services Appeal 2026

Dear Friends in Christ,

Each year, all parishes in the Archdiocese of Detroit embark upon the CSA (Catholic Services Appel) Drive. The CSA is a required collection taken up for the general operational expenses of the Archdiocese of Detroit. It helps to subsidize Catholic institutions that may not necessarily be connected to or funded by a particular parish. Among these special services are Campus Ministry, Telecommunications, Hospital and Prison Chaplaincies, Central Service Offices, which provide direct assistance to individual parishes, the Marriage Tribunal, and the like. Since the CSA provides for 62% of the operating budget of the Archdiocese, we are assessed or taxed a specific amount we are asked to meet. Our assessment is based upon many factors, including parish registration, Sunday collections, and financial status of the area within our parish boundaries. The detail of how our assessment is calculated, as well as how the money is used may be found on the insert included with today's bulletin.

The amount assessed to St. Anthony Parish this year is **\$42,535**. In order to reach our goal, the recommended pledge amount will be **\$300** from each family.

For your convenience, pledge forms can be found at the bottom of this page. Please complete the form and designate the amount of your pledge and the payment plan you prefer and return to the Parish Office. Pledges may also be made by calling the Parish Office 734-854-1143; sending your pledge via email (stanthony@bex.net) or by stopping by the Parish Office during regular business hours.

Your pledge can be made in several ways: paid in full and returned with your pledge form; a down payment returned with your pledge form, with the balance divided into quarterly payments, or divided evenly among 9 monthly payments. Credit card and automatic withdrawal payments and electronic funds transfers (EFT) will also be accepted. If you wish to contribute this way, please go to: give.aodcsa.org. Please select "St. Anthony, Temperance" on the online form where indicated. Donors may also call (888) 331-8695 to make an online or EFT request.

Please note: If you sign up to make payments on your pledge, the payment schedule will not begin until July 2026.

Please remember that we are required to make an accounting of all CSA cards for our Parish, so even if you are unable to pledge, we ask that you indicate that to the Parish Office as well.

I am grateful for your continued stewardship and prayers.

Thank you for your continual support.

In our first six months of our fiscal year (October-March) SVdP assisted 38 families (68 Adults 37 Children) The assistance included rent 12 times for \$7033, utilities 4 times for \$1567, food pantry 46 visits and provided 58 set ups (each set up includes 3 boxes of food) for approximate value \$3480, and \$300 worth of gift cards for perishable food and gasoline.

Gabriel's Gift Baby Closet has had 272 visits; we average between 45-55 families each month (98 adults and 146 children). The Lord has blessed us with and we have welcomed 10 new babies all born since October 1. We provided over \$30,000 worth of goods which included \$6300 for diapers, \$1500 for pull ups, \$2950 for formula/baby food, \$700 for wipes, \$1700 for personal hygiene products, \$8500 in clothing, and many more items such as car seats, pack and plays, high chairs, bassinets, cribs, bouncers, blankets, burp clothes and bottles. We very much appreciate all the donations both monetary and physical goods so that we can carry on with our mission.

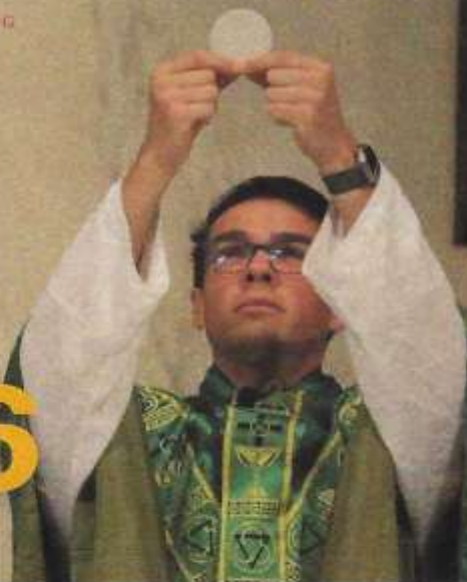
